Rules and Referees Level 1 Course-Theory

The course is the first level in the road to becoming a National and International Referee. The course is designed to develop the player's understanding of the rules and the application of these rules. It will also assist all teams to meet the tournament requirements to have at least 3 people holding a completed level 1 referee qualifications. Tournament levies for non-supply of referees is now set at \$150 per referee with a further requirement to supply 3 referees per team.

Cost: The course is \$80 per ref and WUHA will invoice schools.

The sessions are listed above. Participants on the course will be rostered on to undertake practical sessions during the Mini, Club and Secondary Schools League. Please make sure to include your school and club teams on the application form. The final exam will be held on Tuesday 11th May at WRAC. The test is 30 minutes in duration however you are allocated 90 minutes to achieve a 75 % pass mark.

To round off the course the attendee has to log 10 games to finish the qualification. When these games are completed the attendee sends the logbook to the WUHA Referees Coordinator, for verification. Those people who have logged the ten games will obtain the level 1 Certificate. Attendees will be rostered on for ref duties during school leagues on Tuesday and Friday nights.

Please note that the course is restricted to **32 participants**. Each senior team has been allocated 2 slots. The slots can be filled with either senior or junior players. A player is required to have been playing for at least 1 year before doing the course. Please let me know if you can't fill those slots asap.

UWHNZ Referee Accreditation System

Level 1 (Club Referee)

1. Successful completion of Level one Referee training course.
 - Log book Rules / Manual issued.
2. Referee at least 10 club level games and log them in UWHNZ logbook.
 - Certificate issued upon verification.

Level 2 (National Referee)

1. Hold Level 1 certificate.
2. Referee and log at least 50 games as accredited Level 1 referee
3. Referee and log at least 10 games in any of the following competitions
 - Regionals
 - Interclub Nationals
 - South Island Champs.
 - North Island Champs A grade or above
 - Secondary schools Champs
 - Age group Interzones
4. Referee and log at least 5 games with an accredited Level 2 Referee or Level 3 Referee at any of the following competitions
 - Regionals
 - Interclub Nationals
5. Pass in water evaluations by nominated Level 2 or 3 Referee
6. Successfully complete a level 2 Referee course/exam.
 - Certificate issued upon verification.

Level 3 (International Referee)

1. Hold Level 2 certificate.
2. Referee and log at least 25 games as accredited Level 2 referee
3. Referee and log at least 10 games in any of the following competitions
 - Southern Hemisphere Championships
 - European Championships
 - World Championships
4. Successfully complete Level 3 course/ exam
5. Make application to CMAS through UWHNZ
 - with fee and passport photos.
